

**RESOLUTION of LINCOLN COLLEGE PROCLAIMING
WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 15, 2008 AS
"IT'S TIME TO TALK DAY" AND
THE MONTH OF OCTOBER 2008 AS
"DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH" at LINCOLN COLLEGE**

WHEREAS, domestic violence affects women, men and children of all racial, social, religious, ethnic, and economic groups affiliated with Lincoln College; and,

WHEREAS, domestic violence is one of the most pervasive problems in our society; and

WHEREAS, open discussion is the first step in promoting healthy relationships and overcoming domestic violence; and,

WHEREAS, the Corporate Alliance to End Partner Violence and their partners have established "It's Time to Talk Day" on October 15, 2008; and the month of October is established each year nationally as "Domestic Violence Awareness Month"; and

WHEREAS, media personalities, government officials, domestic violence advocates, businesses, and the public-at-large will be taking a moment to talk openly about an issue that affects every aspect of a community's safety and wellness including the campus community; and


